EQUINE CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

EQUINE CANADA, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EQUINE CANADA is committed to:

Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.

Ensuring that owner, trainer, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.

Providing for the continuous well being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.

Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.

Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.

Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.

Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

***NOTE: All participants at Central East shows are expected to abide by this statement of principle.**

TRILLIUM AND NON-CORE DIVISIONS **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

SECTION 1 – MEMBERSHIPS

1. Any rider(s) entering any class or division at this horse show, and any person or group listed as the owner(s) in the EQUINE CANADA Competition Passport of any horse or pony entered in any class or division at this horse show **MUST** be current members in good standing of the Ontario Equestrian Federation (OEF) and must supply original or photocopy of their 2008 OEF membership card with their entry form, whether or not they intend to collect points toward Central East Zone year-end awards or qualify for the Trillium Championships.
2. Any rider(s) entering any class or division at the horse show, and any person or group listed as the owner(s) in the EQUINE CANADA Competition Passport of any horse or pony entered in any class or division at this horse show **MUST** be current members in good standing of the Trillium Hunter Jumper Association (THJA) in order to have prize winnings at this horse show count for points towards qualifying for the Trillium Championships and Central East Zone year-end awards.

3. All riders and owners of horses or ponies entered in the core divisions/classes at this horse show require current EQUINE CANADA sport licenses in order to have prize winnings count for points towards qualifying for the Trillium Championships and Central East Zone year-end awards.

4 a. Fully updated EQUINE CANADA Passports and current Sport Licenses are required for horses and ponies competing in any Core divisions except Hack.

SECTION 2 – ADMINISTRATION

5. Entries and applicable fees must be received on or before the closing date to avoid post entry fees.

NOTE: Be sure to check the individual closing date for each show.

6. **Refunds: Administration and stall fees are not refundable. NO EXCEPTIONS.** Entry fees will be returned if cancelled in the show office 24 hours prior to the first class entered with proper medical documentation. Once a horse has entered the show grounds, there will be no refund unless authorized by the show committee.

7. No numbers will be issued without full payment or a signed open cheque left to cover all charges and fees incurred by the exhibitor. No numbers will be issued to any horse or rider for whom an entry blank has not been fully completed.

8. All NO SHOW entries, including faxed-in entries, will be charged full entry fees and all other applicable fees. All accounts must be settled prior to the next show, otherwise entries will be denied, and no points will be awarded. Please note any outstanding accounts at year end will not be eligible to receive year-end awards.

9. A \$50.00 charge will be added to all accounts paid with cheques that are returned from the bank for any reason.

10. Show Management reserves the right to change or amend show scheduling up to one (1) hour prior to the designated class.

11. STABLING AVAILABLE. Please see the Stabling Form for details. NO REFUNDS.

12. Under NO circumstances will a PHONED IN entry, stabling request, or cancellation be accepted.

SECTION 3 – GENERAL

13. Current EQUINE CANADA rules will govern all classes.

NOTE: Article 13 applies to both Core and Non-Core.

14. To compete in a stake class, the horse must be entered in the entire division and to compete in the under saddle class, the horse must complete at least one course over fences.

15. No dogs are allowed at the show.

16. Protests, if any, must be made in writing and must be in the hands of the secretary within 48 hours of completion of the class concerned. No protest will be considered unless accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 that shall be forfeited to the committee if said protests are not sustained. Protesting an animal's height carries a \$100.00 cash deposit.

NOTE: Protests are usually made through the steward of the horse show. Also available at the horse show office are Exhibitor Report Forms. These require no cash deposit and may be submitted to the show office, the steward or sent directly to the O.E.F.

17. In the event of a fall of horse and/or rider, the competitor must leave the ring dismounted.
18. **Proper show attire, including jackets, is required for all divisions and classes, including all jumper divisions and judged warm-up classes, unless excused by judge or show management.**

NOTE: Jumper riders are expected to bring show jackets to ride in their classes. Individual show managers may make specific decisions regarding this rule, but jackets are NOT excused unless announced. Exhibitors without jackets may not be permitted to show.

19. Jumper classes, unless otherwise indicated in the Horse Show Prize List and Show Program, will be run under Article 238 AM5. **The use of draw reins is not permitted.**
20. Competitors must be junior or amateur in the Medal Classes.
21. Approved headgear: All competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on competition or event grounds. Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British standard, BSI is also acceptable.
22. Management reserves the right to limit or close the entries of any classes or divisions in an effort to adhere to the timetable.
23. Any horse entered in any class at a competition subject to the requirements to pay drug testing fees may, while on the competitions grounds and on the recommendation of the chair of the provincial Equine Medication Control Committee or the chair appointee, be selected for equine medication control testing.

NOTE: Central East organizers are attempting to provide access to the 3'3" and 3'6" hunter divisions for 2008. If you intend to enter these divisions and want them to run you MUST enter by the closing date of the show, not the day the division runs.

SMALL / MEDIUM HUNTER PONY Division Entry Fee: \$80.00

Open to ponies 13.2 hh and under, fences according to current EQUINE CANADA rules.

LARGE PONY HUNTER Division Entry Fee: \$80.00

Open to ponies exceeding 13.2 hh but not exceeding 14.2 hh, fences according to current EQUINE CANADA rules.

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER DIVISION Entry Fee: \$80.00

Fences 1' 9". Riders showing in this division are not eligible to compete in any other divisions over fences. Open to riders who have not passed their 12th birthday as of January 1, 2008. Open to Ponies and Horses.

NOTE: There is no cross-entry between x-rail division and short stirrup. For the over fences classes there will be a maximum of eight (8) fences, vertical or oxer, to a maximum height of 18". Both horses and ponies may be entered but lines (distances) will not be adjusted.

MODIFIED CHILD/ADULT 2'9" HUNTER Division Entry Fee: \$80.00

Only juniors and amateurs may compete. Riders showing in this division may not enter into any other core divisions/classes at the same show other than the Modified Child/Adult Medal, Hack Division and the Equitation Flat.

NOTE: Horses competing in this division may compete in any other division at the horse show for which they are eligible with a DIFFERENT rider. Riders may not show their modified or any other horse in divisions other than non-core.

HI / LOW WORKING HUNTER Division Entry Fees: \$80.00

Fences 3' 3" and 3' 0" respectively. Height must be declared prior to start of division.

MODIFIED JUNIOR AMATEUR HUNTER Division Entry Fee: \$80.00

Open to all junior and Adult Amateur riders including Children's Hunter and Adult Amateur riders. Fence height 3'3"

Open to all riders except Children's Hunter and Adult Amateur riders. Fence height 3'6"

HACK DIVISION – HORSES ONLY Division Entry Fee: \$60.00

Open to all riders and horses. Passports are not required for this division. Horses exhibited in this division are eligible to enter judged schooling classes.

Show Hack – as per current Equine Canada rules (Art.F1101)

Road Hack – as per current Equine Canada rules (Art.F1102)

Pleasure Hack – as per Equine Canada rules (Art.F1103)

a) Horses in this Division must be over 14.2 hands. Passports not required. The Hack Division shall consist of Road, Show and Pleasure.

(b) Martingales, breastplates, boots of any kind and/or bandages are not allowed. Dropped and flash nosebands are prohibited. Brow bands shall be leather of any description but not solid white, coloured or sequined. F1004.3/4/5 Whips not permitted in any hack class. F1006

EQUITATION CLASSES Entry Fee: \$25.00 per class
Conditions as outlined in the current Equine Canada rules.

“A” Equitation Over Fences

NOTE: Riders are classified as Junior A from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 to the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.

“B” Equitation Over Fences

“B” Equitation on the Flat

NOTE: Riders are classified as Junior B from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 13 to the end of the calendar year in which they turn 15.

“C” Equitation Over Fences

“C” Equitation on the Flat

NOTE: Riders are classified as Junior C until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 12.

MEDAL CLASSES Entry Fee: \$25.00 per class
Conditions as outlined in current EQUINE CANADA rules.

CE Trillium Modified Child/Adult Medal.

It will consist of a relatively simple equitation class over fences – 2’9” class – with the top 10 riders being called back to do a phase on the flat.

CE Trillium Adult Medal

A percentage of riders will be called back to do a phase on the flat.

Jumper Medal – Open to Juniors and Amateurs. Riders are to be judged over a jumper course, which is to include a triple combination and a Liverpool (if possible). There is to be a time allowed. Equitation only is to be scored. Course height a maximum of 3’3”. Course designer should be encouraged to build a course to test the ride ability of the horse and the technical skills of the rider. - Jumper tack as per current Equine Canada rules must be the same used in over fences phase. Jackets are required.

FLAT PHASE: 50%

The top four (4) riders will complete a short test determined by the Judge.

CHILD / ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER Entry Fee: \$40.00 per class

Fences 3’0” to 3’3”. Open to Ponies (ridden by a Junior) and Horses.

Standing martingales allowed but German martingales and draw reins are prohibited. No cross-entry from Child/Adult Jumper to Trillium Jumper on the same horse. A rider may ride one horse in Child/Adult provided he/she is a Children’s or Adult Amateur rider, and a second horse in the Trillium Jumper.

TRILLIUM JUMPER Entry Fee: \$40.00 per class
Maximum height of fences to be 3'6" in the first round.
Up to 50% of jump-off fences may be raised to 3'9".

Standing martingales, German martingales and draw reins are not allowed for any competitor in this division.

NON-CORE DIVISIONS - Class List

Lead Line Class Entry Fee: \$15.00

Open to children who have not passed their 10th birthday as of January 1, 2008. Riders may not cross enter into any other class except Walk / Trot Equitation. Rider / Ponies must be led by a capable handler.

Walk / Trot Equitation on the Flat Entry Fee: \$15.00

Riders may not cross enter into "C" Equitation classes. They may cross enter into the Lead Line class or Cross Rail Hunter Division.

CROSS RAIL HUNTER DIVISION Division Entry Fee: \$40.00 (no prize money to be paid)

Riders showing in this division are not eligible to compete in any other classes except Walk / Trot Equitation. Junior riders showing in this division are not eligible to compete in any other classes except the Walk/Trot Equitation on the Flat. Adult riders are not eligible to compete in any other classes except the Adult Equitation on the Flat. Courses will contain a maximum of eight obstacles and will contain no combination obstacles.

CHILDREN'S PONY HUNTER DIVISION Division Entry Fee: \$80.00

Fences: 2' 0" or 2'6". Declare your height on your entry form. Ponies showing in this division may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different rider. Riders may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different horse. Pony / rider combinations are restricted from competing in any other division requiring them to jump.

There will be no adjustment of striding for pony heights. Lines will be set at a minimum of 72' with no combinations.

CHILDREN'S TRAINING HUNTER DIVISION Division Entry Fee \$80.00

Fences 2' 6". Open Adult Amateur riders. Horses showing in this division may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different ride. Riders may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different horse. Horse / rider combinations are restricted from competing in any other division requiring them to jump higher than 2'9.

Fences 2' 9". Open to all horses and riders. Classes offered may vary by show.

NOVICE HUNTER DIVISION Division Entry Fee: \$80.00

Fences 2' 0" or 2' 6". Horses or ponies showing in this division may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different rider. Riders may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different horse/pony. Horse/rider or pony/rider combinations are restricted from competing in any other divisions requiring them to jump except equitation classes not exceeding 3' 0".

Open to all adult and junior riders.

There will be no adjustment of striding for ponies showing in this division. Lines will be set at a minimum of 72' with no combinations.

ADULT AMATEUR TRAINING HUNTER DIVISION Division Entry Fee \$80.00

Fences 2' 6". Open Adult Amateur riders. Horses showing in this division may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different ride. Riders may enter other divisions requiring them to jump with a different horse. Horse / rider combinations are restricted from competing in any other division requiring them to jump higher than 2'9.
